It's been done before and now it's your turn to experience a trip of a lifetime to:

**Uganda** (the Pearl of Africa)

The expedition element of this trip will see Leaders and groups of Scouts (Venture/Explorer/ Network):

 Undertake the climb of Mount Elgon (A 4,321m peak on the boarder with Kenya) or take part in an Explorer Belt Expedition across a rural District of Uganda:-

On Mount Elgon you will be escorted by local Mountain guides with porters to carry your kit. The Climb takes 4 days and you will experience breathtaking views and see varied flora and fauna.

On your Explorer Belt you will be expected to undertake a 160km Expedition in 10 days undertaking various projects en route. There will be a team in place to help facilitate the planning of your expedition and provide emergency cover during your stay.

 Go on Safari to one of Uganda's many National Parks as well as Visit the source of the Nile (Lake Victoria).

We shall also be recruiting Leaders to both participate and help with the organisation of this expedition.

'**Uganda 2000**' saw 34 Venture scouts and leaders climb Mount Elgon with 24 reaching the summit.

10 Venture scouts gained their Explorer Belts. All 10 came from different parts of the UK and were paired up before departure.
